How to measure your ring size accurately

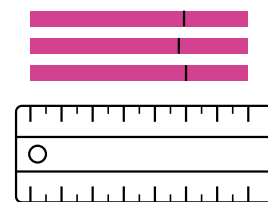


1. Cut a slip of paper and wrap around your finger

(Don't use string - it stretches)



2. Mark the point where the end of the paper meets.



3. Use a ruler to measure the inside circumference. Refer to the table above.
